Election of Parent Governors

Parent Governors shall be persons who are elected by parents of registered pupils at the school, and who are themselves such parents at the time they are elected. A parent, in relation to any child or young person, includes a guardian and every person who has the actual custody of the child or young person.

1. Who can be a governor?

A governor must:

- be aged 18 or over at the time of his/her election;
- not hold more than one governorship at the same school;
- not be a governor at more than two schools;
- not be bankrupt or disqualified under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986 or an order made under section 429(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986;
- not been removed from the office of charity trustee or trustee for a charity by the Charity Commissioners or High Court on grounds of any misconduct or mismanagement, or under section 7 of the Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions)(Scotland) Act 1990 from being concerned in the management or control of any body;
- not be included in the list of teachers or workers prohibited or restricted from working with children or young people (currently called List 99);
- not be disqualified from being a teacher, other school employee or an independent school proprietor;
- not have been sentenced to 3 months or more in prison (without the option of a fine) in the 5 years before becoming a governor or since becoming a governor;
- not have received a prison sentence of 2¹/₂ years or more in the 20 years before becoming a governor;
- not at any time have received a prison sentence of 5 years or more;
- not have been fined for causing a nuisance or disturbance on school premises during the 5 years prior to or since appointment or election as a governor.

2. How long do governors serve on a governing body?

- Any governor may resign at any time, and must give written notice of their resignation to the clerk.
- All governors are entitled to serve a 4 year term of office.
- The terms of office do not prevent a governor from being elected or appointed for a further term, or from being disqualified under the regulations.
