



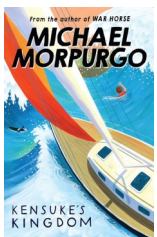

Language, Literacy and Communication



Pupils will continue to participate in weekly spelling and reading sessions in classes.

In our topic work, pupils will be given opportunity to write adventure stories and poetry. We will also be looking at persuasive language in oracy & written work. Pupils will also be given opportunity to read Welsh texts and create their own descriptive writing.

Mathematics & Numeracy

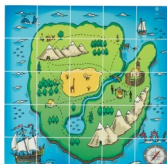
Year 5: Number and place value, divisibility rules and number patterns, properties of triangles, measurement, addition and subtraction of decimals, fractions and problem solving.



Year 6: Number and place value, multiplication of fractions and decimals, shape including quadrilaterals and circles, long division, statistics and data, 4 quadrants and ratio.

Humanities

Pupils will design their own island, focusing on the landscape, climate and geographical location. They will learn about our



patron saint, Saint David and his impact on Christianity in Wales. We will also study Lent and Easter, putting ourselves in the shoes of Jesus and his disciples.



Health & Well-being

All children will have the opportunity to learn about water safety in our intensive swimming sessions at Abergele Leisure Centre this term.



Back at school, we will be learning and practising rugby skills. In our topic work, we will learn the importance of a healthy body and a healthy mind as well as promoting the Five Ways to Wellbeing.



Expressive Arts



Children will be given the opportunity to learn Welsh dances and songs leading up to St David's Day and create art work for our Eisteddfod. During our topic, children will be working with artist Tim Pugh in our local environment.

Science & Technology

Pupils will work with Dwr Cymru, learning how to make clean water. We will construct shelters and think about how we could use renewable energy as a power source on our island.
