

Spring 2022: Survival Island

Language, Literacy and Communication



"Washed up on an island in the Pacific, Michael struggles to survive on his own. With no food and no water, he curls up to die. When he wakes, there is a plate beside him of fish, of fruit, and a bowl of fresh water. He is not alone..."

Pupils will have the opportunity to write for a variety of purposes including newspaper report writing, instructions, scripts, biographical writing and balanced arguments. Through our novel, we will be describing characters and settings, as well as writing about feelings.

In Welsh, pupils will be learning and writing biographies about St Dwynwen and St David. They will also be writing instructions.

Mathematics & Numeracy

Data & graphing, using coordinates, measuring and drawing angles, solving equations and inequalities, calculating area and perimeter, fractions, decimals and percentages, ratio and problems involving money.



Expressive Arts

Pupils will get outside to create their own environmental art with the artist Tim Pugh, using items from nature.

Using our own national anthem as a start point, pupils will compose, perform and appraise their



own national anthem. They will also have the opportunity to contribute to our School Eisteddfod with their 2D, 3D and photography work.

Humanities

Pupils will design their own island, focusing on the landscape, climate and geographical location. They will learn about our patron saint, Saint David and his impact on Christianity in Wales.

We will also study Lent and Easter, putting ourselves in the shoes of Jesus and his disciples.

Science & Technology



Pupils will work with Dwr Cymru, learning how to make clean water. We will construct shelters and think about how we could use renewable energy as a power source on our island.

Health & Wellbeing

Pupils will develop their physical health with our rugby sessions. During the second half of the term they will be swimming at Abergele Leisure Centre and getting into the outdoors to read maps, build shelters and make camp fires!
